

# ANALYSIS OF PARENTS' STRATEGIES IN BUILDING THE CHARACTER OF ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

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## Abstract

This study aims to analyze parents' strategies in shaping the character of elementary school students in Kayen Village, Ngodong Sub-district. The researchers used a descriptive qualitative design. This study involved 12 parents with children aged 7-12 years, selected through a simple random sampling technique. Data collection was conducted through an online questionnaire with 10 open-ended questions, covering aspects of parent-child interaction, values taught, rules applied, supervision of children's socialization, and provision of motivation and praise. Data were analyzed using descriptive qualitative techniques, including calculating and classifying respondents' answers and interpreting results. The results showed that 40% of parents focus on teaching discipline and responsibility, 30% teach moral and ethical values, 20% instil particular values, and 10% overcome children's mistakes and negative behaviour. Strategies implemented at home include applying moral and ethical values (24%), teaching discipline and responsibility (36%), wise use of technology and social media (20%), monitoring children's social interactions (16%), and giving praise and rewards (4%). In conclusion, parents implemented various strategies to shape their children's character, emphasizing discipline, responsibility, and moral and ethical values. However, strategies must be refined to address the challenges identified and maximize future character-building effectiveness.

Students' complexities of character issues necessitate a multi-dimensional approach for effective resolution. Behavioural problems in elementary school students often manifest due to various factors, including inadequate guidance and inconsistent disciplinary practices at home. Research by Johnson and Lee (2022) highlights that gaps influence a significant proportion of elementary students displaying problematic behaviours in parental supervision and support. For instance, children exhibiting behavioural problems such as aggression or dishonesty often come from environments where parental guidance is either inconsistent or absent. In addressing these issues, experts stress the importance of comprehensive interventions encompassing individual and systemic approaches.

To tackle behavioural issues in students, solutions must collectively address the child, the family, and the school environment. At the child's level, interventions such as counseling and mentorship programs are designed to address and modify negative behaviours. These approaches often include structured systems of rewards and support, like the Positive Behavioural Interventions and Supports (PBIS) framework, which has been shown to improve behavioural outcomes in schools (White & Williams, 2023). Such frameworks emphasize the need for structured reinforcement and support to foster desirable behaviours among students.



Family-based solutions are equally critical in addressing character development. The role of the family extends beyond mere supervision; it involves active participation in character education through modelling positive behaviour and maintaining consistent disciplinary practices. Research supports this view, indicating that children exposed to consistent and positive parental behaviour are likelier to develop similar traits (Brown & Davis, 2024). Family interventions, such as parenting workshops and counseling, can enhance parental practices and child behaviour, underscoring the importance of a supportive home environment in character development.

Schools integrating character education into their curricula and collaborating with parents to create a supportive learning environment have demonstrated positive student behaviour outcomes. Educational strategies that involve training teachers on effective character-building techniques and fostering a school culture that promotes respect and responsibility are essential. Research conducted by Green and Clark (2022) suggests that schools with robust character education programs and parental involvement see significant improvements in student behaviour and academic performance

The role of parents in shaping their children's character cannot be overstated. Parents become the first school for children (Apriyanti, 2021) (Mitasari & Apriyanti, 2021). Parents significantly influence their children's behaviour through involvement in their educational and social activities, modelling ethical behaviour, and implementing consistent disciplinary practices. According to Anderson and Lee (2023), children learn by example, and parents who consistently demonstrate honesty, kindness, and responsibility are powerful models for their children. This behaviour modelling helps reinforce the values parents seek to instil, contributing to the development of positive character traits in their children. Disciplinary practices are another critical component of character development. Consistent and fair disciplinary practices help children understand the consequences of their actions and develop self-discipline. Research by Williams and Brown (2024) shows that children who experience clear and consistent rules, combined with appropriate reinforcement and consequences, are better equipped to internalize positive behaviour.

In conclusion, the strategies employed by parents in shaping their children's character are vital to the overall development of elementary school students. By examining the interplay between parental involvement, modelling of behaviour, and disciplinary practices, this research aims to explore how these strategies can be optimized to foster positive character traits in children. Integrating home and school efforts in character education is essential for creating a supportive environment that promotes the development of strong, positive character traits among students.

#### Method

This research is descriptive qualitative. Data was collected using an online questionnaire through Google Forms to all parents of elementary school students in Ngodong, Kayen village as subjects. The researcher conducted this research in July 2024. There were 10 open-ended questions in the questionnaire. This research was conducted on 12 parents with children aged 7-12. The parents selected as subjects have similarities in education, not further education. Some people do not continue their education to the college level because of economic limitations, environmental influences, or their own choices. The subjects were selected using a



simple random sampling technique. The questionnaire had five main questions: interaction between parents and children, what values parents teach, what rules are taught, supervising children's socialization, and giving motivation and praise to children. Once the data were collected, the following procedures were used to analyze them: exchanging and counting the respondents' answers in Google Forms, classifying the answers, discussing the results, and drawing conclusions.

# **Findings**

## The Role of Parents in Shaping Student Character

Based on the questionnaire results, parents' role in shaping student character can be seen in various aspects, such as moral values, ethics, discipline, and responsibility. The results of the questionnaire are summarized below:




Figure 1: Parents' Role

As described in Diagram 1, 40% of parents teach discipline and responsibility to their children. Moral and ethical values are taught by 30% of parents, while 20% instil particular values. The remaining 10% of parents focus on addressing their children's mistakes and negative behaviours.




Figure 2: Parents Strategies
