

CHAPTER III

RESEARCH METHOD

This chapter will discuss the research design, data source, data collecting technique, data analysis.

A. Research Design

In this research, the researcher employed qualitative research. Qualitative research is done without giving priority to numbers but focuses on the deep understanding of the interaction between concepts that are analyzed (Semi, 2012: 28). Qualitative research tends to study things in their natural setting, attempting to make sense of or interpret phenomena in terms of the meaning people bring to them. The qualitative research is descriptive. It means that type of qualitative research in this research focused on description. The data observation is taken from the book in the series novel *The Chronicles of Narnia: The Voyage of the Dawn Treader*, including the prologue, monologue, and dialogue that support this research. In this case, the researcher focused on King Caspian X's struggle to find his father's seven best friends and how he and the Dawn Treader's members faced the challenge during their journey.

B. Data Source

Two data sources will be used in this research,

1. Main Data Source

The main data source of this research will be taken from the script including the prologue, monologue, and dialogue of the serial novel *The Chronicles of Narnia: The Voyage of the Dawn Treader*. The novel was published by HarperCollins e-books in 1952 in the United Kingdom and printed by the researcher himself.

2. Supporting Data Source

For supporting the data, the researcher used other sources. The researcher took and read the review by the people from the internet

C. Research Instrument

To ease the process of collecting the data, the researcher used field notes as the instrument. There are many different data concerning the analysis of intrinsic and extrinsic elements. F. Data Analysis

Data analysis was a process whereby researcher systematically searches and arranges the data to increase their understanding of the data and to enable them to present what they learned to others. This study applies the descriptive qualitative method. Descriptive research is research that is used to describe subjects, phenomena, or characteristics about what is being studied (Mason & Bramble, 1978: 31). According to Miles and Huberman (1994: 11), there are three major phases of data analysis.

1. Data Reduction

Data reduction refers to the process of selecting, focusing, simplifying, abstracting, and transforming the data that appear in written up field notes or transcriptions." Not only do the data need to be condensed for the sake of manageability, but they also have to be transformed so they can be made intelligible in terms of the issues being addressed.

2. Data Display

Data display goes a step beyond data reduction to provide "an organized, compressed assembly of information that permits conclusion drawing and action." A display can be an extended piece of text or a diagram, chart, or matrix that provides a new way of arranging and thinking about the more textually embedded data. Data displays, whether in word or diagrammatic form, allow the analyst to extrapolate from the data enough to begin to discern systematic patterns and interrelationships. At the display stage, additional, higher-order categories or themes may emerge from the data that go beyond those first discovered during the initial process of data reduction.

3. Data Drawing/Verification

Conclusion drawing involves stepping back to consider what the analyzed data mean and to assess their implications for the questions at hand. Verification, integrally linked to conclusion drawing, entails revisiting the data as many times as necessary to cross-check or verify these emergent conclusions.

G. Research Procedures

This research was conducted in three stages. Those are preparation, implementation, and writing result reports. The explanation will describe below:
